I visited Fossil Park in Sylvania, Ohio. It is by Toledo. There was a park worker to help you know what to look for. He showed me what fossils were there, what they were called and the rules. You cannot bring tools there but you can use a rock to dig or a stick to poke at the piles of hard dirt. You can wear gloves. There is water there to rinse off the fossils you find. I found mostly brachiopods and crinoids. I also got a big piece of pyrite. I didn't find any trilobites this time. It is a good place for a rock hound to go because of all the fossils and it is free to get in.
